

UNION MEMBER DISCOUNT 2022/23: UNION FAQ

One of our members wants to claim the union at Birkbeck and has asked me to verify their membership status. What do I need to do?

Anyone from within the union with access to the membership records to verify the member's current status and length of membership can approve their discount claim. The confirmation email must come from a **recognised union email address in lieu of a signature**.

Please send an email with the member's full name, membership number and their current membership status and length of membership to feesinv@bbk.ac.uk. This confirmation email must be received within 28 days of the member enrolling at Birkbeck for the discount to be applied.

If the member is claiming the discount for the first time, you will also need to confirm that to the best of your knowledge, they do not have a first degree as this is one of the eligibility criteria for new applicants.

What is the other eligibility criteria to receive the union learn discount?

I want to know more about data sharing between Birkbeck and the unions

When the member applies for the discount, they are required to give their consent for their union to pass on to Birkbeck their: full name; membership number; membership status and length of membership so that their discount can be applied.

On the application form for the discount, members are also asked to give consent for their name, programme of study; mode of study (full-time or part-time) to be supplied to the union on request to allow them to monitor the impact and uptake of their members studying at Birkbeck. Without consent, this data cannot be shared.
