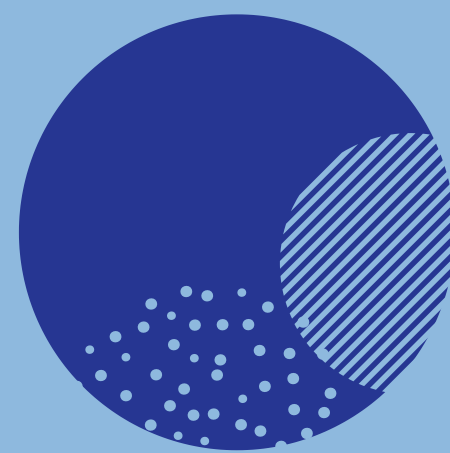

Communications Assistant Chartered Manager Level 6 (Degree with honours)

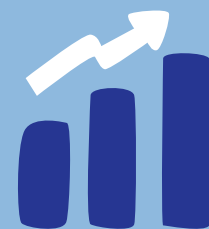
£20k-£21k per annum
