## 14 | Programme Rationale & Aims

This is a time of accelerating environmental crises: climate breakdown, biodiversity loss, increasing stresses on, or conflicts over, natural resources as a result of pollution, overconsumption, inequality and poverty and the unintended or negative impacts of advancing technology. Individuals and societies have increasingly turned to the law for solutions to environmental problems. While legal responses have been innovative and creative, challenges persist in the use of law to respond to complex environmental problems.

Birkbeck's LLM degree in Environmental Law, Policy and Governance is an innovative research-led programme aimed at graduates. It offers postgraduate students the theoretical and practical knowledge crucial for a nuanced understanding of the ways in which policy, the law and governance structures respond to environmental problems.

At Birkbeck we focus on a critical understanding of environmental problems and responses to them as well as their intersection with other challenges such as racial and economic inequalities. In addition, students will be introduced to law, policy and governance responses to environmental problems from a variety of sources: international, EU and different national legal systems.

The programme adopts blended learning techniques employing online activities, materials and tools alongside in-person or online or seminars.

## The programme aims to:

- Introduce students to core themes, principles and theory underpinning environmental law;
- Facilitate students to develop a nuanced understanding of environmental problems and the various applicable governance tools and frameworks;



- Expose students to a range of ideas and scholarship across disciplines;
- Develop students' ability to understand and critically analyse a range of literature, policy and legal instruments at an advanced level;
- Equip students for a career in practice, policy work or research at an advanced and marketable level;
- Deliver flexible, blended learning through a variety of online and VLE-mediated tools and, if possible, in person sessions.

A 2:1 degree in law or in any degree programme related to the aims and content of the programme. Relevant work experience will be considered.

## 16 Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the programme, students will be expected to be able to:

- Understand and explain key legal mechanisms and frameworks for protecting the environment;
- Understand the intersection between environmental and other societal challenges, as well as the interaction between environmental and other areas of law;
- Transfer their understanding of complex problems and regulatory responses to different contexts;
- Critically evaluate legal, regulatory and policy proposals concerning environmental challenges;
- Engage with contemporary legal and policy discussions regarding environmental challenges;
- Draw on relevant literature and law to independently generate and communicate written or oral discussions on the themes of the programme.

## 17 Learning, teaching and assessment methods

The course is delivered via three terms of seminar teaching, taught in the evenings. The programme adopts blended learning techniques employing online activities, materials and tools alongside inperson or online or seminars reserved for advanced discussion and debate. Students will take one compulsory module per term (part time students will need to take both in the first year). The compulsory modules will introduce students to environmental problems and legal responses to them and the second will provide a critical insight into environmental and public health protection law, their evolution, aims and overarching principles. In the second term/year, students choose from a range of specialist optional modules. Students can complete their degree with four optional modules or three optional modules plus a research project module.

## 18 | Programme Description

This is a time of accelerating environmental crises: climate breakdown, biodiversity loss, increasing stresses on, or conflicts over, natural resources as a result of pollution, overconsumption, inequality and poverty and the unintended or negative impacts of advancing technology. Habitat destruction threatens species and communities which depend on those habitats, as well as public health due to the increased risk of zoonosis transmission, as highlighted by the coronavirus pandemic. In response, high-profile movements such as the youth climate strikes, Extinction Rebellion and international concern over toxics in the environment indicate the mainstreaming of concern for the environment and reflect an intensifying search for new ideas, tools, institutions and alternative



economic structures to address environmental problems. The law has long played a significant role in protecting the environment (and indeed in facilitating environmental harm) and, while imperfect, individuals and society turn to the law for solutions to environmental problems.

Birkbeck's LLM degree in Environmental Law, Policy and Governance is an innovative research-led programme aimed at law and non-law, international and national, graduates, including those already in employment as legal practitioners or otherwise. Understanding of environmental problems and means of addressing them will become increasingly important in all aspects of society. This LLM offers postgraduate students a solid and nuanced grounding in the theoretical and practical knowledge crucial for a critical understanding of the ways in which policy, the law and governance structures respond to environmental problems.
