	The programme consists of lectures, seminars and computer workshops. In Quantitative Methods, assessment is based on a research project submitted during the year and a final exam. In the research methods modules, assessment is based on research projects, assignments or essays submitted during the year.

18	Programme Description
	This part-time course is designed for people working in social research or cognate areas who find themselves needing a stronger grounding in qualitative and quantitative research methods. There is an emphasis on applying research techniques. Epistemological issues in designing research projects are also addressed. Students take four core modules throughout the academic year (60 credits).
